

Friends & WMS Students Bring Significant Story Of The Ku'e Petition To Life



WMS students, teachers and community friends recently presented the celebrated one-act play, "Ka Lei Maile Ali'i – The Queen's Women," for all 7th Grade Social Studies classes as well as students from other Waimea schools – re-creating a now famous meeting held in Hilo in 1897 regarding the historically significant Ku'e Petition. This petition -- discovered in the National Archives of the Library of Congress in Washington, D.C. in 1997 revealed what had been forgotten -- that more than 90% of the native Hawaiians living at the time signed the petition protesting annexation of the Hawaiian Kingdom. The play is based on a newspaper article written at that time by reporter Miriam Michelson from San Francisco who attended the auspicious 1897 meeting in Hilo. Mahalo to everyone who helped share this interactive lesson with our students.

WMS is one of 10 schools in Hawai‘i to apply for and be awarded a **Hawai‘i Community Foundation** grant to support student success with a strong college and career preparedness focus. Called “**Connecting for Success**,” (CFS) a significant part of grant involves connecting students with adult mentors, and toward this end, we are honored to have “connected” with a new all-men’s mentoring group, called **Boys To Men Hawaii**, headed by **Michael Bonahan**.

These are some of the **Boys To Men** members who have undergone both screening and training and are now meeting with WMS 7th and 8th grade boys once a week during lunch and Advisory.



A number of other community members have committed to becoming mentors including several staff members of **Keck Observatory** and **The Fairmont Orchid**. To participate, interested community members are required to go through a background check, TB screening and an interview.

Mentors meet with their mentee either before or after school, at lunch time or during **Homework Help** (Tuesdays or Thursdays after school) or **Hot Chocolate Club** (Mondays, Wednesday or Fridays before school). Meetings take place on campus on the average of 1-2 times a month for 30-60 minutes.
