<u>Hōkūle'a and Hikianalia Are Embraced with Kamaile Aloha</u>- Kamaile High School students took a leading role in the welcoming of Hōkūle'a and Hikianalia to their coast. After years of involvement with the Polynesian Voyaging Society, the week allowed the students to continue their personal crew

training, share their experiences with their community, and pass on their knowledge to the next generations of voyagers. On Saturday, three students had the incredible honor of sailing aboard Hōkūle'a from Nānākuli to Pōka'i Bay and taking part in the beautiful welcoming ceremonies from the Wai'anae community. On Monday, the students led more than 200 grade 3 and 6 students through stations at Pōka'i Bay to visit the canoes and learn about voyaging. These students then led a Learning Journey on Monday afternoon on the Kamaile campus to share

our school's work with PVS crew members. Finally, on Tuesday evening, the students were invited along with the PVS crew to dinner at MA'O Organic Farms to share their experiences.
