Literacy and Social Studies Curriculum Coordinator Kamaile Academy HSTA (10-month)

Summary:

The Literacy and Social Studies Curriculum Coordinator provides leadership for Curriculum, Instructional, and Assessment in the areas of Literacy and Social Studies. The Curriculum Coordinator also provides leadership in the development, articulation, and implementation of an instructional program and leads in the coordination of staff professional development in this area.

*Note: This is NOT a supervisory position and DOES NOT include the evaluation of colleagues.

Essential Functions and Responsibilities:

- Work collaboratively with the other curriculum coordinators, coaches, and Administration to accomplish expectations.
- Collaborate on the creation of an overall PD plan including, but not limited to Literacy and Social Studies core curriculum, assessment, and instructional strategies.
- Provide expertise and leadership in the design and implementation of Academic Literacy Multi-Tiered Systems of Support.
- Provide expertise and leadership in the development of a P-5 Curriculum plan as it relates to Literacy and Social Studies.
- Provide expertise and leadership in the creation of an Assessment plan for Literacy and Social Studies.
- Provide expertise and leadership in the creation of an Instructional Strategy plan as it applies to Literacy and Social Studies.
- Provide expertise and leadership in the establishment and the communication of clear expectations for P-5 Literacy and Social Studies.
- Work with administration to ensure that resources are in place for the implementation of instructional programs, strategies & practices.
- Monitor the implementation of expectations and instructional programs, as related to
 Literacy and Social Studies through observable classroom practices and student learning.
 Monitoring will also be completed by the Learning Director, Po'o, VPs, and curriculum
 coordinators.
- Support in the planning and the facilitation of P-5 professional development as related to the area of Literacy and Social Studies.
- Provide expertise and leadership in reviewing and refining PD plan based on collected implementation data.
- Lead/Facilitate selected PLC meetings as applicable to the school-wide plan.

- Provide expertise and leadership in the refinement of how data is used to inform classroom practice as related to Literacy and Social Studies.
- Work with Administrative Team in the improvement of staff competencies.
- Actively participates in faculty and grade level or department meetings, assist building
 efforts to plan, budget, implement, and evaluate the school's program and to do related
 work as required. In carrying out these responsibilities, the Coordinator will follow
 school policy and procedures, standard practices, and approved curriculum, and will
 actively and positively support the school vision.
- Perform other duties that may be assigned as it relates to Literacy and Social Studies.

- Current State of Hawaii Teacher Licensure.
- Successful completion of a teacher education program at an accredited college or university.
- Successful five (5) years of teaching experience.
- Ability to effectively communicate with parents, students, and staff verbally and in writing.
- Commitment to collaboration and teaming.
- Ability to use appropriate assessment, instruction, and evaluation techniques.
- Ability to utilize effective practices to build a community of learners.
- Knowledge of child and adolescent development and ability to apply that knowledge to the selection and application of curriculum materials and instructional practices.
- Knowledge of skills and strategies necessary to meet the diverse needs of students.
- Knowledge and skill in culturally responsive teaching and learning.
- Knowledge of the relationships between teaching and learning.
- Skill and ability to utilize technology to aid instruction, assessment and learning.
- Commitment to participate in professional growth opportunities and reflection.
- Reliability in attendance, punctuality, and follow-through.

- Masters or Doctorate degree in Education/Teaching.
- Demonstrated content knowledge and research-based instructional strategies for Literacy and Social Studies.
